## Rev. Ben Meyers (he/him)

The Rev. Ben Meyers loves living near Lake Merritt in Oakland, CA. His ministry spans 28 years: half of that time as a parish minister and half as a social justice/community minister. He is the proud father of two sons and loves spending as much time as possible with his two-year old grandson. His passion is working with individuals and faith-based communities throughout the country as a Solar and Clean Energy consultant. His mission is to accelerate the adoption of clean energy as a moral and spiritual imperative. As a proud parent of a transgender child, he is also a vocal ally and avid advocate for LGTBQ+ rights.

## Jilchristina Vest (she/her)

Jilchristina Vest is the homeowner and curator of the Women of the Black Panther Party Mural which graces the exterior of her house in West Oakland. Born in Chicago in 1966, the year of the birth of the Black Panther Party, she moved to the Bay area in 1995. She earned degrees in Black Studies, Women's Studies and Multicultural Education. As a lifelong educator and activist, Jilchristina Vest is motivated by love of community and deep appreciation for the women of the Black Panther Party.

## Rev. Cheryl Dawson (she/her)

Rev. Cheryl Dawson, M.A., M.Div. began her lifetime of community service in the Black Panther Party. Today she continues on that path of service as a minister who offers workshops, classes and sermons for women impacted by incarceration.

## Rev. Kevin Alan Mann (he/him/siyá)

Rev. Kevin Alan Mann serves as a Chaplain with Sequoia Hospice. As a Queer Filipino American Unitarian Universalist, Kevin's ministry is rooted in centering people from the margins and building collective solidarity towards anti-racist multicultural Beloved Community. He received his Master of Divinity and Social Change from Starr King School for the Ministry in 2016 and completed his Chaplaincy Residency at California Pacific Medical Center in 2018. Kevin was ordained by the First Unitarian Church of Oakland on October 1st, 2023 and is one of the founders of Bay Area DRUUMM (Diverse Revolutionary UU Multicultural Ministries).

## Rev. Dr. Caroline Knowles (she/her)

Rev. Dr. Carrie Knowles describes herself as a recovering psychologist and recovering attorney, who graduated from Starr King in 2011 and was ordained to UU ministry in 2013. Along with providing pastoral care at BFUU and preaching at Bay Area churches as a guest speaker, she writes poetry, short stories, and is working on a memoir.

## BFUU Congregational Meeting

The BFUU Annual Congregational Meeting will be held after service on **Sunday**, **June 9**<sup>th</sup> **at 12:30pm in Fellowship Hall and on Zoom.** Our agenda will be available soon, and we'll be electing new members to the Board of Trustees. There are three open seats for 2-year Board members, and two open seats for 1-year Board Alternates. The election process will be held as it has been recently - via survey with follow up emails/calls as possible.

The Nominating Committee endorses Margaret Hurlbert, Mike Gardner and Phoebe Sorgen for the 2-year seats, and Ben Burch and Tom Luce for the 1-year Alternate seats. For information about each of these candidates, please see their bios below and on the next page.

The Nominating Committee is grateful on behalf of BFUU for members who submitted their names for the committee's consideration.

Any member can run for an open Board seat by petition. Per Bylaw VI, E, "Additional nominees, who shall previously have agreed to serve if elected, may be placed on the ballot by written petition signed by at least ten (10) voting members of the Fellowship and filed with the Nominating Committee not later than the Saturday preceding the last Sunday before election." This year, the deadline for written petitions is **Saturday**, **June 3**. Petitions should be dropped in the mailbox at BFUU or mailed in time to be delivered by Saturday, June 3. Petitioners should also email office@bfuu.org or call 510-841-4824 ext. 1 and leave a message to advise that a petition has been submitted.

## BFUU Board Nominees - 2-year seats

## Margaret Hurlbert (she/her)

Margaret has been coming to the Fellowship for many years, and has been active in the Choir, Chair of the Music Committee, and has taken part in many events and concerts. She has also been active in the Social Justice Ministry. Some projects she has worked on include going to ICE detention centers and protesting the internment of children, going to Climate Change marches with BFUU, helping with concerts and dances and the ukulele group at BFUU, and organizing making soup at BFUU for Consider the Homeless.





### Mike Gardner (he/him)

My adventures with BFUU began when my first wife and I were married in Fellowship Hall in 1967. We began attending and were inspired by the spiritual message of the minister, Clark Olsen, and his activism, and that of the Social Action Committee, now the SJC. We joined the Fellowship and became active members. In 1980 I stepped away from BFUU. However, after years of trials and tribulations I realized that again I was seeking to grow and express a sense of spirituality for both my political and scientific interests. In 2014 I rejoined BFUU, along with my wife Jinky. Since then I've been a member of the Ministerial Relations Committee, a member of the Personnel Committee and a member of the Board of Trustees.

## Phoebe Thomas Sorgen (she/they)

Phoebe became a BFUU friend 30 years ago when she enrolled her boys in the RE program. She became active via the Social Justice Committee, which she eventually chaired. After becoming a BFUU member, she was elected to the Board when BFUU transitioned from lay led and hired Rev. Kurt Kuhwald in hopes of increasing membership. She served on the then newly reconstituted Personnel Committee, and has also been on the Aesthetics and Nominating

Committees. For effective peace, democracy, and human rights advocacy, Phoebe was a 2005 Outstanding Woman of Berkeley and 2015 Tom Paine Courageous Spirit awardee. As a Peace & Justice Commissioner, she wrote many Resolutions that were adopted by the City of Berkeley. Phoebe is on the Steering Committees of Move to Amend and Berkeley Citizens Action, she also serves as a BFUU Board of Trustees (appointee) because our beautiful BFUU community means

## BFUU Board Nominees - 1-year Alternate seats

### Ben Burch (he/him)

I grew up in Davis, and attended a UU Sunday school at the Davis Fellowship (later Church) in the '60s, and was later involved in LRY (UU youth group) there as well. After flirting with anthropology and East Asian studies (BA and MA), I got a library degree, and worked in that area until my retirement in 2009. I was already active in BFUU at that point (having joined around 1997), and continue to do, having served on the board several times. Currently serving as Treasurer, I hope to continue to play a role in making BFUU a sustainable beacon for our 7 principles, as well as continuing to move us toward truly building a beloved

community, and at the same time encouraging us to bring our principles to our participation in the broader local community.

### Tom Luce (he/him)

In 2000, Tom joined his hometown — Barre, Vermont — UU Church because they were the only church supporting the same-sex marriage law. As an already defrocked Catholic priest for having married, this was a final departure. And now another personal social justice fight. After retiring from teaching in his hometown and moving with wife, Judy, to Berkeley in 2005, Tom, as a member of Oakland UU, began working in 2006 with Cynthia Johnson on the "Declaration of Peace", a national campaign for stopping the Iraq war that was proposed at the GA in Louisville Kentucky as an AIW. Soon after, he joined

BFUU and has continued to promote antiracist work, e.g. convincing BFUU to endorse the #8 Principle calling for accountable antiracism work.





At the May Social Justice Committee meeting, in support of Gaza, we unanimously agreed to endorse the Aug. 19 march on the Chicago Democratic National Convention, organized by a broad coalition of progressives including the National Lawyers Guild and Code Pink.


