Here is a statement of commitment to promote the rejection by the U.S. and other countries of Haiti due to racism. Today Haiti is in the worst situation it has been since 1804 when it abolished slavery. Frederick Douglass, as an abolitionist had to work hard on Haiti. And there is, unfortunately, a lot of racism in the U.S.

"If, by a true statement of facts and a fair deduction from them, I shall in any degree promote a better understanding of what Haiti is, and create a higher appreciation of her merits and services to the world; and especially, if I can promote a more friendly feeling for her in this country and at the same time give to Haiti herself a friendly hint as to what is hopefully and justly expected of her by her friends, and by the civilized world, my object and purpose will have been accomplished." - Frederick Douglass

# Rev. Ben Meyers (he/him)

The Rev. Ben Meyers loves living near Lake Merritt in Oakland, CA. His ministry spans 28 years: half of that time as a parish minister and half as a social justice/community minister. He is the proud father of two sons and loves spending as much time as possible with his two-year old grandson. His passion is working with individuals and faith-based communities throughout the country as a Solar and Clean Energy consultant. His mission is to accelerate the adoption of clean energy as a moral and spiritual imperative. As a proud parent of a transgender child, he is also a vocal ally and avid advocate for LGTBQ+ rights.

# Gillian Fynn (she/her)

Gillian was born in England, raised in Africa, in what was Rhodesia, now Zimbabwe. She then lived internationally, coming to the US in 1978. Gillian lives in Berkeley and is fortunate to have two adult children and two grandchildren living close by. She is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, now semi retired. She worked for many decades in the field of Maternal/Child Health, particularly mental health.

# Tom Luce (he/him)

Now 87, born in Barre, Vermont, I chose to go to the Catholic seminary in 1956 and one of my classmates was Max Dominique, a Haitian from a leadership family, the reason why I chose to go to Haiti in 2004. In 2000, I joined my hometown UU Church, First Church Unitarian, Barre, Vt., because they were the only church supporting the same-sex marriage law.

After retiring from teaching French and Spanish in my hometown and moving with wife, Judy, to Berkeley in 2005, I, as a member of Oakland UU, began working in 2006 with BFUU's Cynthia Johnson on the "Declaration of Peace", a national campaign for stopping the Iraq war that was proposed at the GA in Louisville Kentucky as an AIW in 2006. Soon after, I joined BFUU and have continued to be supportive.

Because of my relationship with my wife, I participate in a local Catholic parish, St. Columba, Oakland, where I was asked to develop an international service program, <a href="https://example.com/hhee-in-2010">HopeForHaiti:Education/hhee,</a> in 2010 since I had already developed some community based groups in Port-Au-Prince. This group has survived and is in its 15<sup>th</sup> year providing school for a total of 1,000+ students in the inner-city communities of Martissant and Grand Ravine.

We broke them in on the national day of global action, Saturday April 5 **in front of Berkeley Tesla on 4th Street. People protest there every Saturday at noon, also at College/Ashby on Fridays at 5pm**. On the national "Hands Off" day, Gillian and Phoebe organized an earlier gathering at 11:00 am which was well-attended, then went to MLK Park for a more intimate but more visible protest, while Margaret and others went to North Berkeley BART station which, though less visible, garnered a huge crowd. Resistance may be more important than ever, and solidarity lifts our spirits in this time of frightening news.

# Social Justice Watch cont'd

Later that day, a training at BFUU prepped Travis Air Force Base protestors who blockaded April 9 in honor of <u>David Hartsough</u> who passed recently.

On April 12, our second **Peace Gathering** at BFUU was an inspiring success! Two featured speakers on Africa were riveting, <u>Anne Garrison</u> of <u>Black Agenda Report</u> and a gentleman from Congo Connect and Thrive, as were representatives of multiple organizations, networking and connecting the dots! Code Pink raised over \$300 for UN Relief by selling delicious home made baked goods. Thank you, Hank, and all who helped!

On April 16, another wonderful event took place in our Hall: **Indigenous Rights, Climate Forests in Chile**: Report Back featuring Anne Petermann and Orin Langelle on the Mapuche struggle to reclaim ancestral land, culture, spirituality, and food sovereignty. This was also a book launch and signing of "Portraits of Struggle" by Orin Langelle, organized by our longtime ally, Karen Pickett of Bay Area Coalition for Headwaters.

Time for another Project Censored book party at BFUU? They're doing excellent research re treacherous military AI.

Far rightwing organizers have achieved **RECALLS of progressive electeds** nationwide, including SF DA Chesea Boudin, Alameda County DA Pamela Price, and Oakland Mayor Sheng Thao. Next targeted-Contra Costa County DA <u>Diana Becton</u>. It's difficult to adequately counter pervasive lies when we are hugely outspent and media is complicit. But maybe we can save Becton, and Barbara Lee is replacing Thao! So keep the faith, and keep resisting in large ways and small. Enjoy the process!

SJC usually meets on 3rd Sundays after lunch in the foyer. Sorry I forgot the April meeting because I had a gig in SF and my son just got married, officiated by his former BFUU RE teacher Rev. Jeff Melcher.





