Benin Lesbian Safe House

The Benin Lesbian Safe House provides shelter to lesbians in the Benin Republic, a small traditionally homophobic nation in West Africa. Five lesbians live in the Safe House and it serves as a community center for many other lesbians in the city of Ouidah. Lesbians in Benin frequently experience homelessness, family rejection, and violence. The Safe House provides trauma counseling and vocational classes in preparing probiotic and fermented food and beverages.

All donations will go towards paying the \$250 lease on the Safe House for the upcoming year.

Te Martin is a song-keeper and ritual artist. They have been shaped by Ocean, Redwoods, circus arts, and theater games. They facilitate oral tradition singing classes and workshops that focus on song as a tool for collective liberation, somatic regulation, and ancestral connection. Te served as co-organizer of Thrive Street Choir in the bay area for six years. Listen to their album, "Water & Bones" and music video, "May This Body Be a Bridge".

Rev. Ben Meyers (he/him)

The Rev. Ben Meyers loves living near Lake Merritt in Oakland, CA. His ministry spans 28 years: half of that time as a parish minister and half as a social justice/community minister. He is the proud father of two sons and loves spending as much time as possible with his two-year old grandson. His passion is working with individuals and faith-based communities throughout the country as a Solar and Clean Energy consultant. His mission is to accelerate the adoption of clean energy as a moral and spiritual imperative. As a proud parent of a transgender child, he is also a vocal ally and avid advocate for LGTBQ+ rights.

Prince Muraguri (he/him)

Prince Muraguri is a development economist who recently returned to his home country Kenya after working at UC Berkeley. Passionate about using data for impact, he works on research that informs policy across Africa. Now navigating life as a new dad together with his partner Patriciah, Prince is embracing the joys and challenges of raising their growing family.

Tom Luce (he/him)

Now 87, born in Barre, Vermont, I chose to go to the Catholic seminary in 1956 and one of my classmates was Max Dominique, a Haitian from a leadership family, the reason why I chose to go to Haiti in 2004. Because of my relationship with my wife, I participate in a local Catholic parish, St. Columba, Oakland, where I was asked to develop an international service program, HopeForHaiti:Education/HHE, in 2010 since I had already developed some community based groups in Port-Au-Prince. This group has survived and is in its 15th year providing school for a total of 1,000+ students in the inner-city communities of Martissant and Grand Ravine.

Rev. Dr. Bonnie Dlott (she/her)

Since retiring after 11 years of ministry with the Napa congregation, Rev. Bonnie Dlott had the privilege of serving the UU congregations in Santa Rosa and Petaluma as a contract minister. Rev. Bonnie is a Bay Area native and spends her time communing with nature, cooking, traveling, and playing with her two grand babies.

Since 2017, BFUU has hosted an on-going series of art exhibitions on the walls of Fellowship Hall. "Behold! Be Bold!" provides recognition and display space for underrepresented artists to showcase and sell their work.

Almost everyone has artistic talent. But very few persons of color, women and LGBTQIA+ artists have equal opportunities to share their creative visions of beauty and resistance with the wider world.

Hundreds of people visit Fellowship Hall each week--students from the New School, participants in dance and music programs, churchgoers, social justice activists. The art works displayed on the walls add a visual dimension to the primary purpose for which visitors come to BFUU.

ArtEsteem, founded in 1989, serves school age children through on-site classes. The organization presents a large show to the community once a year. Selected pieces from the most recent show will be on display when the artists speak about their work in a Q&A format.

This will mark the eleventh show for Behold! Be Bold!. Previous participants have included Edythe Boone, famed local muralist, Jimi Evins, abstract artist, Guy Colwell, painter and cartoonist (also BFUU's sexton at the time) and Rev. Gayle Dickson, former graphic designer for the Black Panther Party newspaper.


