August 17: Love in the Long Days

Prince Muraguri (he/him)

This is a sermon about endurance love—the kind that doesn't rely on spark, but sacrifice. Perfect for both marriages and faith, it honors the quiet strength that holds us together when emotions fade.





August 24: Radical Histories, Radical Futures

Gregory Stevens (they/them) This presentation invites us to remember that our Unitarian Universalist lineage is steeped in revolt — the Jesus movement defying empire, the desert mothers and fathers renouncing wealth, the Radical Reformers risking all for freedom, the Transcendentalists expanding minds, and the liberal theological pioneers of the early 20th century. Today that same spirit demands we carry on our radical tradition, get to the root of our current polycrisis, and build an ecosocialist future...or face extinction.

August 31: A Love Supreme Sumi Hoshiko (she/her)

Freedom begins when we stop judging who we are. What are the stories we tell ourselves about how we could or should be "better"? Have we rigorously examined how these strivings may paradoxically be holding us back from the most wondrous love we could experience? This talk is not about loving your neighbor. It's about having the courage to take the radical step of loving yourself without conditions, qualifications, footnotes, if only's.


