#### **November 2: Make Them Hear Us** *Nell Myhand (she/her)*

P2 President's Corner

The California Poor People's Campaign is organizing statewide to demand that our Senator's Padilla and Schiff hear the voices of their constituents who are bearing the brunt of Public Law 119-21, the Big Brutal Budget that took effect on 10/1/2025. Three components, building power through telling our stories and survival projects will lead to meetings with both California senators with our observations and demands.





**November 9: Blessing the World** *Rev. Bonnie Dlott (she/her)* "Blessing is the art of harvesting the wisdom of the invisible world."

These words were written by Irish teacher and poet John O'Donohue, whose blessings are loved by people all over the world. Today we will hear some of Rev. Bonnie's favorite John O'Donohue's blessings, explore his life-affirming philosophy, and consider how the act of blessing can change our lives.

#### **November 16: The Smallest Among Us** *Sharon Knight (she/her)*

Sometimes the greatest teachings come from the tiniest beings. In this service, Sharon shares what she has learned about love, service, and connection from two tiny kittens and rescuing feral cats. We'll explore how our relationship with animals shifts when we view them through an animistic lens rather than a mechanistic lens, and how that can deepen the already special bond we have with our pets. To help a vulnerable being is to choose life.





**November 23: Feeding the Greater Hunger** Rev. Ben Meyers (he/him) There is an ancient teaching, found in many cultures, of the 'two hungers.' The lesser is for the 'stuff' that sustains daily life. The greater hunger is for expressing gratitude that life exists at all...the sermon reflects on how to feed this greater hunger. Thanksgiving Communion will be celebrated with bread and cider. Special music for the occasion.

## **November 30: Wear This Body With Loving Kindness**

In a culture both obsessed with, and disgusted by, our bodies, what does it mean to be an embodied being? From our first breath to our last we are sustained and sometimes entrapped in our specific unique remarkable body. The Berkeley Food Pantry is a non-profit organization providing emergency groceries to Berkeley and Albany residents in need. Through the combined efforts of three paid part-time staff, over 100 dedicated volunteers, the Alameda County Community Food Bank, community members, local businesses, and the USDA Emergency Food Assistance Program, we provide emergency groceries for 3 days or 9 meals to over 2,000 Berkeley and Albany residents monthly. We are proud that we provide over 70,000 pounds of nutritious food each month to Berkeley and Albany households in crisis. For each \$1.00 donated, we are able to purchase \$7.00 worth of food!


